## CHAIR



### **EMERITUS PROFESSOR GREG WHATELEY**

DipT., B.Ed., B.Ed(Mus)., GradDipEdAdmin.,M.Ed(Mus).,Prof.D.,CertIVTAE. FIML, FACR

Emeritus Professor Whateley completed a *Diploma of Teaching* (with majors in Music and Psychology), a *Bachelor of Education* (Curriculum Design and Development), a *Bachelor of Music Education* (with a music education focus), a *Graduate Diploma in Educational Administration* (with a focus on Organisational Behaviour), a *Master of Education* (Assessment and Evaluation) and a *Doctorate* in Virtual Pedagogy. Throughout his teaching career he has maintained a keen interest in how and why people learn.

Dr Whateley began his teaching career (1975 – 1988) in the area of **music and arts education** at primary, secondary and tertiary level. He has taught at every level of formal education (K – PhD) and has either, taught and/or researched, in four States and five Countries.

He commenced his full time work in the tertiary sector at the *University of Tasmania* in Hobart (1989-90) as a **Lecturer in Music Education**. He moved to *Griffith University* on the Gold Coast (1991-1999) as a **Lecturer/Senior Lecturer in Music Education**. He served as **Head of School - Arts** and during that time managed the Film and Television Music postgraduate awards at the University and the *Queensland Conservatorium of Music* where he also served as **Deputy Dean** (External Relations). He became **Associate Professor and Director** of the *Central Queensland Conservatorium of Music* (2000-2003) where he co-founded (with Ian Bofinger) Australia's first 'Virtual Conservatorium'. He also held the position of **Head of School – Creative Arts** and **Manager, Business Initiatives** in the Faculty of Education and Creative Arts.

He took the position of **General Manager** and **Professorial Head of School** at the *Australian Institute of Music* (2004 – mid 2005). He also held the position of **Senior Visiting Fellow** at the College of Fine Arts, University of New South Wales (2006 - 2008) and **Director of Education and Quality** at the National Centre for Language Training (an International Centre of Excellence at the University of New South Wales) from mid 2005 to end 2008. Greg held the position of **Senior Visiting Fellow** at Wesley Institute (2005- 2011) where he **chaired the** Academic Board and managed the Master of Music program (Arts Management strand). In 2008 Greg was appointed **Principal** of the *Australian International Conservatorium of Music*. He was also **Consulting Chair** of Arts Management at the Sydney Opera House in association with the Australian Institute of Music. In 2011, Greg accepted the post of **Deputy Dean** at *UWSCollege, University of Western Sydney* and later became **Professor and Dean** of *The College* (Western Sydney University). In April 2016, Greg was appointed **Executive Dean** of the *Universal Business School Sydney*. For seven+ years Greg was the **Chair** of the Academic Board at the *Australian Institute of Music (AIM)*. Greg's teaching areas included Teaching Pedagogy, Human Behaviour, Organisational Behaviour, Critical and Contemporary Management, Qualitative Research Methodology and Music History & Form.

**Emeritus Professor Greg Whateley** is currently **Deputy Vice Chancellor**, Group Colleges Australia researching and writing in the areas of Quality Management and eQuality. He is also **Chief Operating Officer** for PAX/Tr4inright. Greg retired from Teaching Research, Management and Leadership in October 2019. He is **author** of more than 320 external publications and advises and writes in the areas of accreditation, quality assurance, government reporting, eLearning, mLearning, bLearning and hLearning. He is currently a **Member** of the Editorial Board for the *International Journal of Innovation, Creativity and Change*; a **Reviewer** for the *British Educational Research Journal*; a **Reviewer** for *IGI Global*; **Co-Editor** of the *GCA Publication Series*; **Chair** of the Board of Directors, *Australian Academy of Music and Performing Arts*; **Chair** of the Academic and Examination Board of *Stanfort Academy (Singapore)*; **Chair** of the Academic Senate of *UBSS*; **Chair** of the Academic Board of the *Australian Guild of Music Education*; **Chair** of the Advisory Board, *PAX Institute*; **Member** of the *Elite Education Council*; **Director**, *Group Colleges Australia*; and **Chair and President**, *Musicum20*. Andrew is also a Lecturer at the *New York University Sydney* Campus, where he lectures in Marketing, reporting to the *NYU Stern Business School*. He was involved in the establishment and the continued delivery of the NYU Internship Seminar, a workplace integrated learning subject, in Sydney as part of the *NYU Global Partner Program*.

Prior to his current positions, Andrew was Dean of UBSS during 2015. From 2010 to 2014 he was a Lecturer at *Macquarie University* in Strategic Marketing, introducing two innovative workplace integrated learning initiatives. A team based business simulation game was incorporated into the Capstone Marketing Strategy subject in which Andrew was the Lecturer. Richard Xi is the **Senior Post Graduate Coordinator** at UBSS.



**Art Phillips** is a two-time Emmy Award winning composer with credits spanning feature films, television, advertising and documentary series including Santa Barbara, Neighbours, Missing Persons Unit, Outback House, Pirate Islands: The Lost Treasure of Fiji, The Flying Vet, The Secret Lives of Sleepwalkers, Catalyst, Dead Tired, Made in China, Fatal Bond, Signal One and Sher Mountain Mystery.

As guitarist, arranger, orchestrator, musical director and record producer, Art has performed live on concert tours and record albums for Barry Manilow, Minnie Riperton, Demis Roussos, John Rowles, Ricky May, Burl Ives, The Carpenters television specials and Sally Kellerman, to name a few. Composer of over 100 production music albums for companies such as Universal Production Music, FirstCom Music, 5Alarm Music, Sonoton, One Music, Bruton, Chappell Recorded Music Library, Groovers Music, Access Music, EVO, and his own production music label 101 MUSIC PTY LTD, now with 42 album releases in the 101 Music catalogue.

His production music has been used in television shows throughout the world including Cold Case Files, Hollywood Medium, America's Most Wanted, Current Affair (US), Celebrity Profile, NYPD Blue, The Oprah Winfrey Show, Survivor, 60 Minutes, Dancing With The Stars, The Dog Whisperer, E True Hollywood Story, The Ricki Lake Show, Good Morning America, Amazing Medical Stories, Harry's Practice, The Great Outdoors, Dateline, Extra-The Entertainment Magazine Show, E-News Daily, Fox Sports, Lost JFK Tapes The Assassination, National Geographic., NBC Sports, NFL Redzone Replay, Celebrity Page, Weather Caught On Camera, Secrets of the Earth, Fugitive Task Force and The USA Today Show. In 2018, he was nominated by the Production Music Association 'Mark Awards' (USA) for 'Best Jazz Artist' for his album 'Italian Holiday' (101M032) featuring Phillips on electric and acoustic guitars, released by his record label 101 Music Pty Ltd. Also, that year, Phillips received a 'Global Music Award' for this same album, 'Italian Holiday'.

Art is the longest standing President of the Australian Guild of Screen Composers (AGSC), 2001 ~ 2008, and was Vice President from 1992 ~ 2000. Art Phillips obtained a 'Master of Music Studies' from the Queensland Conservatorium of Music / Griffith University in 1999.

In 2016, Art was appointed Deputy Chair of the 'Academic Board of The Australian Institute of Music' (AIM.) He is a councillor for 'Music Australia', formerly known as 'The Music Council of Australia', representing 'Music in Film and Television', 2005 ~ current. He is also 'International Relations Liaison' for the 'Australian Guild of Screen Composers', and acts for the AGSC with observer status on the 'Music Creators of North America' (MCNA).

Phillips has passed on his knowledge and expertise to countless students at Universities and Institutions across Australia and abroad, and is an active and valued member of the global music community. Art is currently the Director of the Centre for Entrepreneurship and is also a lecturer at UBSS in the postgraduate program.

Professor Hayek has been involved in higher education in various capacities over the last 26 years. Jim has lived and taught in a number of countries during a career in education which spans more than 40 years. Earlier working in commercial theatre and radio in London he eventually moved fulltime into education in 1979.

Jim is internationally recognised for his contribution to, and work in, founding an academic research methodology combining performance and research (critical ethnodrama) which is intended for use by graduate arts students and arts and health practitioners seeking to voice the concerns of marginalised communities.

From 2013 Professor Mienczakowski was CEO, President and Pro Vice Chancellor of Curtin Malaysia until he and his family returned to Australia in early 2020. He returned to Australia to take up the role of Curriculum Director and Acting Principal at Thomas Carr College. He commenced partnerships with Lianyungang Foreign Language School, and Wenzhou No.21 School to deliver the VCE in China (2012). He then moved to Firbank Grammar School as Head of Transnational Education, where he expanded the number of schools delivering VCE offshore to ten, making Firbank the largest provider of VCE offshore.
