Incentives Provided by UBSS for Domestic MBA Students

As part of the contribution to COVID-19 recovery, UBSS is offering 100 Bursaries to Executive Delivery Mode MBA students. This further demonstrates the commitment from CEO Alan Manly OAM and the GCA Board to assist postgraduate students with continuous learning, to get that promotion, a new career or launch a new business.

Students studying their MBA via the Executive Delivery Mode are eligible to apply for 1 of 100 COVID-19 Bursaries to make their studies more accessible in the wake of the pandemic. This 80% bursary reduces fees down to \$399 per subject (from \$1,999). As at July 2022 there are currently 50+ students using the scheme – and judging from the ongoing feedback – very much enjoying the course and the delivery mode.

The bursaries are restricted to domestic students only and within the Executive Delivery Mode MBA only.

We are delighted to introduce our Fellows. Our Fellows provide the UBSS student cohort and Alumni with integral 'work integrated learning' (WIL) experiences, by sharing their expertise and business knowledge through interviews, special presentations, case studies and seminars. The value of our Fellows is clearly recognized to create a better tomorrow for today's students.



CFE Start-Up Competition

'CFE Start-Up' is a unique competition for postgraduate UBSS students and **Alumni** of UBSS, focused on acknowledging and awarding innovative and entrepreneurial business plan concepts and proposals.

The competition submissions must be in the form of a written word document using our ENTRY FORM, *which will be sent to you within two weeks*, describing the detail about the business you

propose for the competition based on the **CRITERIA** noted below. If your submission reaches the top 6 finalist's stage by our select judges you will be asked to create a verbal presentation pitch using powerpoint at our online CFE Start Up Competition **'Event'** scheduled for Monday, December 12, 2022, from 6.30 pm ~ 8:30 pm.

Submissions must be from 'individuals', not partnered proposals.

The award categories are:

Most Innovative Business Concept – something new, something different, something that stands out from the current marketplace, a business and product(s) that will solve numerous problems for customers.

Greatest Social Impact & Sustainability Business Model – something that resolves issues relating to making the world or the community a better place, something that comforts an ongoing concern or awareness in our society, something that is sustainable and resolves any issues about saving the planet.

Contest winners will receive an Award Certificate; a discount on one future subject selection at UBSS; complimentary access to an IML Virtual Leadership Workshop; a recommendation letter to a choice of your request; and two 30-minute mentorship sessions with a sought-after business executive associated with IML or an entrepreneur Fellow of the UBSS Centre For Entrepreneurship.

CRITERIA

Entry submissions must include a $1000 \sim 1500$ word-length detailed explanation, using our ENTRY FORM (which will be sent in a future email to you) describing what your unique business concept is about, detail of the innovative product or service you are offering, how you will launch the business and product with a marketing scheme, the benefits of your business and why you feel the product will make a difference in the world or in our community.

You must also include who you feel your top 2 competitors might be, ones that you can compare your product with or a substitute for existing products in the marketplace and describe why and how your business will gain positive momentum over the competitive market. You should note which of the above 2 categories you feel best suited for your business proposal, *however our judges have the right to place your submission proposal into either of the 2 categories that they feel best suited*.

A brief profit margin forecast should also be noted in your written submission, such as: in year 1, the business anticipates a gross profit of X %, with a final net profit of X%, and a growth in year 2 of X %.

PROCESS

The 6 finalists will be informed on **Tuesday**, **November 1** if they are chosen as a 'finalist' by our selection judges, when the finalists are required to begin preparing a compelling 8-minute business pitch about their business, including an executive summary about the business, the product, including a logo, a concise marketing mission/vision combined statement (one sentence only), a slogan (3 or 4 words), pics of sample product if possible, the unique selling and market position, and why the business and product will make a difference in the marketplace.

The presentation will include a succinct powerpoint slide show (converted to PDF before presentation) of no more than 10 slides (with an engaging 8-minute discussion).

Each of the '6 finalists' will present 'on-camera' via a zoom scheduled EVENT to the 4 **main event judges** – along with an online audience who have registered to view the event. The event will also be recorded.

The presentations will be followed by a 7-minute Q&A from the **main event judges** (e.g. 15 minutes per finalist, as there are 6 = 1.5 hours of presentations.

Following all presentations, the **main event judges** will head into a break-out room to discuss the presentations thoroughly and select the **two winners**, each aligned to 'one' of the categories at the judge's discretion. The winners will then be announced 20 minutes thereafter to the viewers.

JUDGING RUBRIC

Market Validation
Business Model Positioning
Unique Selling Attributes
Detail and Creativity of Slide Presentation and Clarity of Discussion
Professional and Compelling Delivery of Pitch

Each criterion will receive a total of 20 points (e.g. 100 based).

Submissions MUST be received no later than Monday, September 19, 9:00am Sydney time, and sent via email with your proposal using the **ENTRY FORM** *that will be sent to you in an upcoming notification email.*

The '**CFE Start-Up**' is sponsored by UBSS, and co-sponsored by the Institute of Managers & Leaders (IML). The competition will be held on Zoom and will be streamed live on the UBSS facebook page, the IML facebook page, and via a designated event link.
